PROCEEDINGS: IDA COUNTY BOS • JULY 11 MINUTES & CLAIMS

IDA GROVE, IOWA JULY 11, 2023

The Board of Supervisors convened in adjourned session, members present Chair Creston Schubert, Devlun Whiteing, and Raymond Drey.

Minutes of the meeting held June 27, 2023, were read and approved.

Zach Hall, Conservation Director was present to discuss Resolution 23-29 Conservation Agreement in follow up to the discussion last meeting. Hall told the board that Resolution 23-29 did not eliminate the current agreement but updated it to agree that the Ida County Board of Supervisors allow the user fees collected from the Cabins from Crawford Creek to be credited to the General Fund Designated for Conservation Purposes fund effective July 1, 2023. Whiteing moved and Drey seconded the motion to approve Resolution 23-29 Conservation Agreement. All voted Aye.

Whiteing moved and Drey second to approve claims, motion carried, all voting Aye.

Drey moved and Whiteing seconded the motion to approve Dan Remer-Sheriff's Representative on the Compensation Board to a 4-year term ending June 30, 2027. Motion carried, all voting Aye.

The quarterly reports for Auditor, Recorder, and Sheriff were reviewed. Whiteing moved and Drey seconded to approve the reports. Motion carried, all voting Aye.

Resolution 23-30 FY24 Tax Levies was discussed. Drey moved to approve Resolution 23-30, Whiteing seconded the motion, motion carried, all voting Aye.

Details of Resolutions 23-29 and 23-30 are on file and may be reviewed in the Auditor's Office or on the idacounty.iowa.gov website.

Whiteing moved to approve for the Chair to sign AIA Document for L & L Builders to update the change orders thus far on the annex renovation project. Drey seconded the motion. Motion carried, all voting Aye.

Jeff Williams, County Engineer, shared an update on the county gravel roads following last month's report of road conditions. Williams reported Road Superintendent, Jim Peters, drove reported roads and found all but three, had been taken care of prior to him checking them. Williams reported that now all have been addressed. Road Construction update was given. Drey reported a hole in county road 240th just off M25. Williams will check into it. Further discussion about the Landfill/Drainage was brought up by Whiteing. Williams agreed to look into the Landfill issues and follow up with Whiteing. Discussion

resumed regarding 255th Street South of the OABCIG High School. Whiteing requested that the City of Ida Grove and Superintendent of Schools, Matt Alexander, be invited to a future Board Meeting.

At 10:32 a.m., as published, Chair Schubert opened the 2nd public hearing for the consideration of Resolution 23-15, Declaring Emergency Medical Services to be an Essential Service. Those present were Corey Trucke, EMS Director and Larry Folk, Horn Memorial Hospital Emergency Preparedness Coordinator. Trucke reported who the current EMS advisory group would be recommending to the Board for consideration to make up the EMS advisory board. During this time, Drey asked if the rural residence would be represented. Trucke shared that he would feel comfortable not having Sheriff as a part of the voting board members, and instead have rural representation. Further discussion brought up a couple of people of interest by both Schubert and Drey. Trucke will follow up with them and then submit the proposal of the EMS Advisory Board to Administrative Assistant Folk to bring to the next meeting. Chair Schubert asked if the EMS group had any funds to promote the EMS Levy consideration, should it be put on the November ballot. Trucke shared that the EMS Association has some funds that they would use to help promote and publicize should the final reading be passed and approved. It was then shared that Trucke would not be here, in person, for the 3rd and Final Reading of Resolution 23-15, but plans to participate via phone conference. At 11:02 a.m. Chair Schubert closed the public hearing. Whiteing moved to approve the 2nd Consideration of Resolution 23-15 and set the 3rd and final public hearing for Tuesday, July 25, 2023 at 10:30 a.m. Drey seconded the motion and it carried, all voting Aye.

Sheriff Wade Harriman joined the meeting and Renee Von Bokern-HR consultant, joined via phone conference, a discussion was held regarding the Bonus Compensation for Deputy Sheriffs. The conversation held discussed the how, when and details of what the board would like to see as guidelines to such hiring incentives. Von Bokern stated she would be submitting a draft of guidelines that were tentatively discussed. She will submit them to Wade Harriman, Lorna Steenbock and Charlys Folk.

Call to order: President Whitmer at 6:59 p.m.

Motion by Wittrock, second by Kalin to approve agenda as presented. Motion carried 6-0.

In public comment, Greder addressed the boards with many reasons to allow middle school girl wrestlers to join the high school girl wrestlers at the beginning of the high school wrestling season.

Motion by Kalin, second by Aschinger to approve the hiring of Shaun Winkel as a high school paraprofessional. Motion carried 6-0.

Motion by Wittrock, second by Schossow to approve the bid from MTC Mechanical for an air handler replacement at the high school. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Wittrock, second by Witzke to change policy 403.1 for bus driver medical certificate reimbursement from a max of \$75 to \$100. Motion carried 6-0.

Motion by Aschinger, second by Witzke to approve the bid for Chromebooks from CDW. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Wittrock, second by Kalin to approve the recommended fees as presented for the 2023-24 school year. Motion carried 6-0.

Motion by Witzke, second by Kalin to extend the district's dead week to run from July 20-30 of 2023. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Aschinger, second by

Kalin to approve the bid by Barry's Electric to install retractable plugs in place of the hanging boxes in the industrial tech area. Motion carried unanimously.

In his superintendent report, Bisenius updated the boards on the closing date for the alternative school, facilities projects, the security grant, the summer lunch program, staffing needs, registration plans, and some options for the branding project.
